

Terrence Shannon Jr. – vs 12/02/22 vs. Maryland

Left handed wing, he mostly played on the right wing. He used his athletic ability to impact both ends of the floor. He did not shoot the ball well this game. He was able to score offensively by using his change of speed off the dribble, he suddenly accelerated from the top of the key, easily passed by his defender to the rim for a layup going left, and off of a dribble handoff going to his right and left. He was particularly effective this game on the offensive glass, where he converted 3 of his 4 rebounds into putbacks, and was fouled on the fourth one. When guarded by a smaller defender, he posted up on the left elbow and went right at his opponent's chest for the score. He used his dribble penetration to kickout to a shooter in the corner once the defense started to collapse on his drives. He was able to get easy baskets off of his defensive rebounds as well, the first one for the layup mentioned earlier, and the second one he made a good pass ahead in transition for the layup. Defensively, he showed great hustle by consistently closing out aggressively, being physical in the post against bigger opponents and playing the passing lanes for deflections. He was often matched up against bigger players in the post but was noticeably aggressive in denying the entry pass to them. On one play, he fronted his opponent on the left block and denied the entry pass, then immediately rotated to the baseline to force the ball handler to pick his dribble up. He did a good job of moving his feet laterally on the perimeter, and used his verticality to contest jumpers and layups.
