

**Julian Champagne** (St. John's) 6'8" 220 SF/PF (Film 1/31/21 vs. Marquette)

Champagnie had an excellent game in this one. He showed off his versatility during the game on both sides of the ball. I did not love the body language he showed though. At times he was openly upset and looked as if he was whining about his teammates. Once on an overthrown pass and once when he did not get the ball.

On offense he scored 22 on 7/14 shooting and hit 4 three points too. Last time I watched him play he was used more as a post while this time he was used on the perimeter often. He was significantly more efficient from the outside. He popped on most picks he set and hit multiple threes off of them. Julian also hit a three off a step back and another coming off a pin-down that the defense went under on. Champagnie showed the ability to beat bigger defenders off the dribble by either scoring off floaters or getting fouled.

On defense he showed the ability to move his feet and stay with both wings and forwards. He also defended in the post 1v1 relatively well. At 6'8" he was playing the 5 for most of the game and was holding his own perfectly fine. He boxed out and rebounded well too.

Overall, it was an impressive game and I believe he should be getting more attention from scouts in general. He is listed at 6'8" while guarding multiple positions and shooting the ball well. He is shooting 43% from three on the season and 84% from the free throw line. He has clear ball skills that shows he can handle on the perimeter as well.
