

Jared Rhoden (Seton Hall) 6'6" 210 SG/SF (Film 12/11/20 vs. St. John's)

At 6 foot 6 with what appeared to be solid length Rhoden has ideal size for a wing in college basketball. With what seemed to be plus athleticism on a couple plays he has potential to be a great defender as well. He had two fouls with 14 minutes left in the first half and after that he just never got going in what was an underwhelming game for the junior.

Rhoden seemed hesitant at times with what looked to be little confidence in his own ability. He shot 1/5 from the field, missed both three point attempts and passed up on a couple other shots. He had a couple turnovers that came off of his drives or just him second guessing himself. He had a couple drives where he showed the ability to get in the lane. One drive he took off from almost outside of the lane, showing off some athleticism, in an attempt to dunk the ball but got called for a charge and was not all that close to finishing the dunk. In all you can tell he has more to his game than I was able to see tonight, but it was a season low in points for him and he didn't contribute offensively in other ways.

Defensively, he got beat off the dribble a couple times. He seemed to possibly be cautious of fouling again after having two fouls early in the first half. But he allowed right handed players to get to their right hands on drives multiple times. He has the size and athleticism that should ensure that he is a good defender in college. He did work hard and had a great hustle play after one of his turnovers. His biggest impact on the game was without a doubt rebounding. He finished with 9 rebounds while attacking the glass the whole game.

I will need to see him play more as it seems that I saw him on his worst shooting performance of the season. He has never scored single digits in any of the previous games this season and had two games of over 20 points.
