

### **Kennedy Chandler (February 15,2022, vs Kentucky Wildcats)**

In the first half of this game Kennedy Chandler was aggressive on the offensive end. He was able to score in transition. In transition he was dynamic and was able to operate as the ball-handler and on leak-outs. When operating as the ball-handler, he was able to attack the rim and make pull-up threes. When operating on leak-outs he was able to make catch and shoot pull-up threes. A play in which Chandler leaked out in transition was with 12:28 minutes left in the first half. In this play, he filled the left lane well in transition and was quick leading to a high-percentage catch and shoot three on the left wing. He had a quick release and fluid shooting mechanics. In transition, he had speed and was able to outrun the Kentucky Wildcats leading to high percentage shots.

Chandler was strictly an off-ball player this game and didn't get many opportunities as the ball-handler. In the half-court, he struggled to create his own shot. He couldn't create enough separation from the Kentucky Wildcats' defenders for a good quality shot off the dribble. His lack of size and physicality also made it hard to create his shot over defenders with more size.

In the second half, Chandler was very passive and wasn't as aggressive in looking to score. He was finding the open man and setting his teammates up for good shots inside. He was able to find cutters and mismatches in the post when playmaking.
