

Allen Flanigan (Auburn) 6'6" 215 SG (Live 2/13/21 vs. Auburn)

Flanigan is a bigger guard that has good size and athleticism for a 2 guard. He seemed significantly taller than Devin Askew who he was guarding for most of the game and seemed to have good length as well. He moved well too. He seems to be a good athlete who was able to use his size well.

Offensively he started the game off poorly. In the first ten minutes he missed his lone shot attempt and had three turnovers. After this he did not shoot well from deep but played better. He scored well around the rim, specifically on floaters. He was able to use his body to score over bigger defenders. He had a pretty pump fake into a one dribble pull up for a mid-range jump shot. He is shooting about 35% from three on the season and 77% from the free throw line. I believe he is a good shooter; he was attempting difficult shots from deep today, but his form looks clean.

Defensively he started the game by picking the ball up right at half court and pressuring Askew. Askew struggled really to get any type of downhill attack on Flanigan. He was sitting in a stance, moving his feet, and using his length to make things difficult. He was also able to have success while guarding Isaiah Jackson who forced up a bad shot. I believe he has good functional strength along with his size to be able to switch onto bigger forwards.

Allen Flanigan has ideal size and length for someone who played as more of a guard rather than a wing. He took over point guard responsibilities when Cooper was out of the game. I do question his decision making with the ball in his hands as he had 5 turnovers and forced some shots. As a prospect I do see potential as a potential NBA draft pick but more likely to be in the second round.
