

**Ron Harper Jr. (Rutgers) 6'6" 245 SF (Film 2/24/21 vs. Indiana)**

In this game, Ron Harper managed to find his shooting stroke that has been missing over the past couple weeks. He shoots 4/7 from three and scored 20 on 12 total shots. Most of his three points attempts were catch and shoot opportunities. He missed a pull up three in a PnR opportunity as the ball handler. A lot of his offense came off weak side spot ups and PnP. He scored a couple times in transition as well. Coming into the game he made 2 of his last 32 three's. It was a much-needed game for Harper.

Defensively, he showed the ability to hold his position in the post and his strength. At 6'6" he is able to guard bigger defenders between how strong he is and his length. I believe he is quick enough to be a solid perimeter defender as well. He was aggressively pursuing defensive rebounds throughout and managed to pick up a couple steals as well.

I still believe his best route to being an NBA player is locking in defensively and rebounding then spacing the floor on offense. Now that hurts when his shot is down to 32% compared to how he was shooting in the beginning of the season. A large part of his career will rely on his jump shot.
