

Jaylin Williams (Auburn) 6'8" 230 PF/C (Live 2/13/21 vs. Auburn)

Jaylin Williams plays the 4 for Auburn as a stretch 4. He seems to have long arms and decent height to be right around his 6'8 listing with a decent amount of weight to him. Athletically he was a solid athlete that was able to move well.

On offense he brings value by being able to stretch the floor. His shot is unorthodox as he kind of brings it to his right side and above his head in a looping motion. He shot 1-4 from three in this game but is shooting 37% on 78 attempts on the season. His lone make from beyond the arc was off a dribble where he got some rhythm while being contested. He shoots just under 55% from the free throw line on 17-31. He is not much of a playmaker; he did not really create much for himself or others as most of his game relies on popping off of picks or spotting up on the perimeter.

Defensively he did a relatively good job. He was able to force some turnovers on drives against Sarr and Brooks. He moved his feet well for a forward, but I am not entirely confident he could stay with guards. He is strong and was able to hold his ground on post ups often. He showed the ability to protect the rim as well as he had two blocks and is averaging over one a game.

Jaylin Williams ability to shoot at his size will always make him valuable. I am not sure if he shoots the ball well enough or is good enough to make an NBA roster. I would imagine he stays in school and goes undrafted eventually.
